Authorship clarification

Role of the Corresponding Author

One author is assigned as Corresponding Author and acts on behalf of all co-authors and ensures that questions related to the accuracy or integrity of any part of the work are appropriately addressed. The Corresponding Author is responsible for the following requirements:

1) ensuring that all listed authors have approved the manuscript before submission, including the names and order of authors; 2) managing all communication between the Journal and all co-authors, before and after publication,* 3) providing transparency on re-use of material and mention any unpublished material (for example manuscripts in press) included in the manuscript in a cover letter to the Editor,4) making sure disclosures,

Authors will be asked to resolve the dispute themselves.
